This network was set up in 1996 due to the Regional Conference on Migration that took place in Mexico (Plan Puebla). The network is conformed with several Trocaire partners from Guatemala, El Salvador, Honduras and Nicaragua; holding Guatemala the technical secretariat from 2006 to 2007, and Honduras from 2008 onwards.</p> <p>During 2007 the network strengthened its work in the region as well as its lobbying capacity in the drafting of public policies related to migration and advocating on behalf of migrants. Besides building the capacity of the network members and joining efforts on migration awareness issues throughout the region, the network has become the most valid stakeholder to advocate and lobby regional governments on migration issues at the regional governmental migration conferences. RROCM had an active role at the XXII Regional Migration Conference (RMC¹) held in Canada in April 2007 as well as at the Regional Consultation Group on Migration (RCGM²) held in Nicaragua in October 2007.</p>

¹ Regional Conference on Migration (RCM) or Puebla Process is an intergovernmental forum established in 1996 to sustain a regional dialogue and an exchange of ideas as well as experiences, for joint consideration and cooperation, on migration issues of common interest to the participating countries which are Belize, Canada, Costa Rica, Dominican Republic, El Salvador, Guatemala, Honduras, Mexico, Nicaragua, Panama and the United States. There are also observer states of the RCM (Argentina, Colombia, Ecuador, Jamaica, and Peru) and observer international organisations (IOM, UNHCR, ECLAC, the ICHR, the SICA, the Special Rapporteur of the United Nations on the Human Rights of Migrants and the *Secretaría General Iberoamericana*).

	<p>The RMC recognizes RROCM as the network of non-governmental organizations located in RCM member countries with which there is an ongoing dialogue and joint cooperation on migration issues and activities. Moreover, it agrees that RROCM shall continue to have a space on the agenda of the Regional Consultation Group on Migration and of the Vice-Ministerial meetings and if appropriate, the Vice-Ministers may suggest a topic on which the CSOs could make recommendations to the Vice-Ministers at the next Conference.</p> <p>The RROCM submitted to the Regional Conference on Migration (RCM) a joint capacity building programme for the governments on the CRM, Central American civil society and the RNCOM itself. During the RCM that took place in New Orleans in 2007, the governments approved this training plan and have started working on the proposal to set it up. The Honduran government (who holds the Presidency Pro-Tempore for 2008) has committed to follow up on the issue and it is hoped something more concrete will be structured next year. In addition, RROCM has started dialogue with IMO and UNHCR to include them in the training as well. The capacity building proposal has as its main objectives to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Jointly reflect upon human mobility and migration from the perspective of different roles by the State and civil society organizations in protecting and promoting human rights of migrants; and • Increase reciprocity in evaluation, knowledge, awareness, coordination, and approach among agents involved in the migration process regarding management of migration flows and human rights of migrants. <p>Being one of the expected outcomes to develop a joint overview emphasizing ways and mechanisms to strengthen protection and promotion of human rights within the framework of policy-making and establishing mechanisms to manage migration flows in the region; as well as a list of areas where joint training/education is required.</p> <p>Support the RROCM has been crucial to progress on migration issues at a regional level as many Trocaire partners in the Central American region are members of this network. Attempting to lobby regional governments at an individual level would have been a failure. However, the network has managed to establish direct and equal dialogue with the governments of the region and make their priorities and requests clear to the RCM.</p>
